Subject: Request Board Consideration and Authorization to Apply for the State of Florida EMS Matching Grant to Obtain Refrigerated Medication Storage Units

Statement of Issue:

This agenda item requests Board consideration and authorization to apply for the State of Florida EMS Matching Grant Program to obtain Refrigerated Medication Storage Units.

Background:

The Florida Department of Health, Bureau of EMS manages an EMS Trust Fund that is filled through fees associated with non-criminal civil violations (primarily traffic violations). Other than 15% that is used for the administration of the Bureau; the remainder of the trust fund is used to provide grant opportunities to the Counties and EMS agencies of Florida, specifically for the improvement of EMS provisions.

The EMS matching grant program is subdivided into two categories:

1. Matching Grant Program has a 75% State and 25% County match funding.
2. Rural Matching Grant Program has a 90% State and 10% County match funding.

Unlike previous years, this year the grants that are eligible for the rural county category no longer require separate applications to be submitted. One application will provide access to both the standard match and rural match grants.

An excerpt from this year's grant advertisement is copied below:

All rural applications will be assessed for both 75% and 90% state funding unless the rural applicant writes on the first page of its application "Solely consider for 90% grant." Rural agencies should not send two applications for the same project or extra copies. All other applications will be evaluated for 75% funding.

The primary Florida Statute authorizing the Grant program is copied below:

401.113(2), Florida Statutes

The department shall annually dispense funds contained in the Emergency Medical Services Trust Fund as follows:

(b)Forty percent of such moneys must be used by the department for making matching grants to local agencies, municipalities, emergency medical services organizations, and youth athletic organizations for the purpose of conducting research, increasing existing levels of emergency medical service, evaluation, community education, injury-prevention programs, and training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and other lifesaving and first aid techniques.

(1)At least 90 percent of these moneys must be made available on a cash matching basis. A grant made under this subparagraph must be contingent upon the recipient providing a cash sum equal to 25 percent of the total department-approved grant amount.

(2) No more than 10 percent of these moneys must be made available to rural emergency medical services and notwithstanding the restrictions specified in subsection (1), these moneys may be used for improvement, expansion, or continuation of services provided. A grant made under this subparagraph must be contingent upon the recipient providing a cash sum equal to no more than 10 percent of the total department-approved

Analysis:

The purpose of this grant is to improve patient care by purchasing refrigerated Medication Storage Units for all 8 ambulances as well as 3 EMS command vehicles. There are several medications such as the cardiac drug Cardizem which require refrigeration. Staff does not have this capability at this time except using the Station refrigerators and having crew members remember to take the medication with them on all calls. This is obviously not the most effective way to assure a consistent storage temperature. The local hospitals are developing induced hypothermia treatment regimens and rapid prehospital initiation of this process is a major component of the treatment. Some of the medications utilized in this treatment require refrigeration; permitting this grant to mitigate current and future needs.

The table below represents the requested grant amount in addition to \$1,000.00 to cover the estimated costs associated with adding the new medications and the expected use during the first year. Medication costs for the subsequent years will be considered in the EMS medication budget.

If awarded the grant, funding for the match will be allocated from the Wakulla EMS Operating Supplies budget. The grant application is due on or before February 12, 2010 and grant award is anticipated prior to the end of the Department of Health's fiscal year of June 30, 2010.

Options:

1. Authorize the submittal of an application for the State of Florida EMS Matching grant for Refrigerated Medication Storage Units.
2. Do not authorize the submittal of an application for the State of Florida EMS Matching grant for Refrigerated Medication Storage Units.
3. Board Direction.

Recommendation:
